



Community Matters Green Corner with Sandra Gangel

We've all heard by now of recycling, right? We've all searched for that tiny triple-arrow circle/symbol thingy to make sure what we're putting in the blue bag is meant to go in the blue (Although none of us really knows what the number means.)

Then, our hard-working collectors come around every week and sling those seethrough blue bags into their collection trucks. From there, we have a vague idea that stuff gets sorted and magically gets turned into something else useful again. It may or may not involve fire at high temperatures and special moulds for re-shaping. And there may be some wet, squishy paper pulp somewhere along the way....

Actually, recycling is just one part of a larger consideration for us as consumers. There is something called the Green Cycle and its parts are as follows:

Recycling is processing used materials into new products. In true Recycling, the product never becomes waste; as in turning box board into new cardboard boxes or used sheets of paper into ... new sheets of paper - and so on and so on and so on

Upcycling is creating things of better or equal quality, or creating new materials, from waste materials or useless products; this covers everything from making insulation from old denim - yup! it's done - to turning an old door into a dining-room table.

Downcycling is reusing a product for a lesser-quality purpose. While it can save on CO₂ emissions and water consumption (as compared to creating something from new raw materials), downcycling is controversial because it results in a degraded product. Plastics "recycling" is the best example of this: the recycled material is degraded over time because it's increasingly mixed with more and

Green Corner continued from page 7 more other plastics that lower its reusability, thus also lowering the number of times it can be recycled. With each iteration of downcycling, the quality and value of the downcycled product diminishes until the product becomes waste. Most of the recycling we do is actually downcycling.

E-cycling is the recycling of electronics; as in dropping off an old computer at the Eco-Station and letting them get it to a company that will dismantle it for usable parts. (Hopefully, said company will NOT be shipping that work overseas, where small children, working in polluted areas, will be taking said components out.) Ideally, E-cycling can help prevent some toxic e-waste - like cadmium, mercury and lead - from leaching into the environment.

And then there's **Precycling**. This is when you consider all of the above factors before you buy. This could mean looking for something in the list of materials that states that all or part of the product is made from recycled materials and/or that alternative energy was used at the factory that made the product.

As you can see, there are a lot of ways that we, as consumers, can affect the nature of our world. Now that recycling has become old hat, let's challenge ourselves with another element of the Green Cycle.

What is Heartworm Disease?

Heartworm disease is a serious and potentially fatal condition caused by parasitic worms living in the heart and lungs of dogs and cats. It is transmitted when a mosquito carrying infected heartworm larvae bites another animal and transmits the infection. Once a pet is infected, the larvae will move into their tissue and then the heart where they grow and reproduce. Although heartworm is not common in Alberta, it is in neighboring provinces and across much of Canada. If your pet is traveling out of province, it is essential to protect against heartworm. Preventative treatment comes in tablet and topical medication (liquid drops) which are given once a month during the spring and summer seasons. If your pet has traveled out of province and is showing signs of coughing, tiredness, anemia or does not want to exercise, you should seek medical advice from your veterinarian. A simple blood test can confirm whether or not they have heartworm disease. If they test positive - and it is detected early - treatment is available.




