COMMUNITY PRESHCOOL MATTERS

Community and Renewal at Rio Terrace Community Preschool

"Mommy, Daddy - look! I made a spaceship!"

It's space month at Rio Terrace Community Preschool, and the kids are hard at work. Planets, stars, comets and shuttles... theme-based activities permeate the classroom. The kids even made a constellation. But the highlight this month was a trip to the Telus World of Science. Even the three year olds got to go.

Many preschools save out-of-school fieldtrips for the more mature four-year-olds' classes, but at Rio Terrace Community Preschool, we've had such phenomenal parental support this year, so much has been possible. In addition to public excursions, the children have also enjoyed special guests and in-class fieldtrips, such as yoga (during the *All About Me* unit) which helped even the youngest learners to boost focus and self-calming skills early on in the year. Even with the young age of enrolment (children can start as young as 2 ½ years old) the teachers have managed to nurture a sense of community in the classroom, and that has led to high levels of respect and attention from all involved.

"It's a real sense of community, carefully nurtured and tended throughout the year. Our teachers, Shay and Emma, are phenomenal. They foster such a collaborative atmosphere. Every child has a say, every child has a voice. Respect and fun are nurtured in the class, and that sense of self-empowerment spills over into every aspect of the preschool."

"We've made a decision to only have communal parties," explains Miss Shay, the preschool's head teacher. "It started as way to save money, but it's turned into so much more... It's been an unexpected way to build a greater sense of community. Kids from different classes get to know each other, and their parents do too."

"When you're standing elbow to elbow with other parents and little people, fingers covered with glue doing friendship crafts, it's definitely a bonding experience," laughs one busy mom, hair in a top-knot, a camera slung around her neck. "It's been wonderful to see my son blossom this year. He's high energy, the one always running away when other teachers tell him to sit still, but Shay and Emma are just so good – so patient. He listens to them. I think he feels heard." The indoor gym and outdoor playground don't hurt either,



giving kids outlets for their energy, and the daily opportunity to work big muscles and build coordination.

It's a theme we hear over and over again. Respect. A voice. Community.

Rio Terrace Community Preschool is renewing itself, thanks to the dedication of a lot of community-minded people, fabulous teachers, and a great program, but mostly because of the diverse group of families that call Rio Terrace Community Preschool home.

If you are considering preschool for your child next year, we urge you to come check out our bright, sunny classroom, filled with natural light, large outdoor playground and indoor gym. All classes are taught with a fun, play-based approach, because here at Rio Terrace Community Preschool, we believe that it is through play and discovery that children learn most effectively, and best understand their world. 

Community Outdoor Soccer – Register Now

Registration for the EMSA 2016 outdoor community level soccer season is now underway. There are four steps in the registration process for 2016. First step is to review the Soccer Program information on the Rio Terrace Community League website www.rioterrace.ca/programs/soccer. 2nd step is to ensure that you have or obtain a valid (current) community league membership. 3rd step is the actual on-line registration of players at www.emsawest.com/play/register. The last step of the registration process is to attend and make your registration payment(s) directly to the Rio Terrace Community League of one of the Payment sessions. Please note that player registration is not complete until payments have been received.

U12 and older age groups may on occasional have a game on a night other than their assigned night of play. Rio Terrace also has a uniform deposit fee (post-dated cheque) required of either \$30 (U8 – U12 or \$60 (U14 – U18) per player.

All of the Community based Soccer Programs are expected to run from Monday May 2 through the end of June, with playoffs for the U12 and older age groups taking place in early July.

The **Rio Terrace U6 FunSoccer Program** is open to boys and girls born in 2010, 2011 or 2012. U6 FunSoccer takes place Monday and Wednesday evenings at the Rio Terrace School fields from 6:15 PM to 7:15 PM. The dinosaur themed teams are mixed age and gender, and the emphasis is on fun, activity and learning some soccer skills for both the youth players and their adult companions – there is a lot of parental involvement on the field with the players at this age. 80+ children were in this Program last year and we look forward to seeing as many smiling faces this year.

You can **register on-line now** for all of the Rio Terrace Soccer Programs at www.emsawest.com/play/register. You will either use your existing EMSA Household account (if you registered a child for the recent Indoor season) or you will need to first create a Household account and then proceed to registering players individually. The EMSA West registration website has a guide to help you through the process.

When registering on-line please be sure to indicate Rio Terrace as your preferred community to play in, include any

'play with friend/coach requests' as these help us to sort through the registrants and form teams, and please indicate whether you can volunteer to help coach or manage the team that your child will play on. Teams can only be formed if we have sufficient coaching / manager support for that team. Rio Terrace is very fortunate to have so many parents volunteering as coaches or managers, but at the younger age groups we are always recruiting new volunteers. Free coaching course are available (usually in April) for anyone stepping forward to help coach a team.

Once you have completed your on-line registration, you are then ready to make your payment. Rio Terrace will hold a Soccer Registration Payment receiving session on Saturday March 5 from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM at the Rio Terrace Community League hall (15504 - 76 Ave NW). You will need to bring the following to the Payment session: 2 copies of the completed registration form for each player registered, Alberta Health Care card, proof of your current Community League membership status and your payments. Payment methods include cheques or cash / bank draft at this point but we are looking into being able to process credit cards or take on-line banking transfers - check with the RTCL website before March 5 for an update. There will also be a multiple community payment receiving session at the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel (16615 - 109 Ave NW) on Tuesday March 8 between 6:30 PM and 9:00 PM.

Current community league memberships are numbered 15-XXXXX and expire Aug 31, 2016 – These are what you need for the coming Outdoor soccer season. Those needing to purchase a membership can do so as follows: anytime at the Rio Terrace Mac store (corner of 156 St. & 76 Ave), at the Rio Terrace Outdoor Soccer Registration Payment session on Saturday morning March 5, or on-line at www.efcl.org/membership.



Rio Gardens!

Rio Gardens! has just completed their Annual General Meeting and there are several items that we would like to announce to the Community:

On March 19th we will be holding a Potluck Breakfast at the Church. This will be open to the general community. There will be a short meeting to plan for 2016 garden season and information regarding the Rio Gardens! will be available. If you are interested in becoming a member, or just want to join us for some fellowship please email us at pmjohns@shaw.ca

The community garden has a large functional composting system. We invite anyone to add their compostable material (vegetable matter – no meat or meat products) throughout the year. For more information please contact Ann

(wildrose.consulting@shaw.ca). Our compost system keeps such materials out of the landfill and the resulting compost is used to enhance the garden beds.

Growing native fruits such as Saskatoon berries, high bush cranberries, blueberries, honeyberries, chokecherries and pin cherries have many benefits. These plants produce edible fruit that can be eaten straight from the bush or used in many varied recipes including jams and jellies, compotes, ices, sauces and all kinds of desserts. Many are high in vitamins and antioxidants. The fruit, if left on the plants, also attracts native birds and provide a winter source of food for non-migrating species such as bohemian waxwings. Native berry bushes are adapted to thrive under local climatic and soil conditions and require less care and attention than more exotic fruits.

The Rio Terrace Church and Rio Gardens! are interested in planting native fruit bushes/trees around the Church and garden areas and will be purchasing these in the spring. Although we don't yet have full details we are planning a fundraiser for the gardens where we make native fruit plants available for sale to the community at large. We do not yet have a date but watch for more information.

On April 23, we will do our spring cleanup. We invite anyone in the community interested in gardening to join us to meet the gardeners, learn more about gardening and composting. Meet at the gardens behind the church at 10 AM. A planting bee will occur in the following weeks.

GREEN MATTERS

Green Corner by Sandra Gangel

I thought I'd do a book recommendation this column. You may have heard of it already, and even better, you may already have read it. The Inconvenient Indian by Thomas King. It was a CBC Canada Reads choice a few years ago. It's subtitled, A Curious Account of Native People in North America, and with good reason. King himself explains the title in his introduction.

I think every Canadian (and American, for that matter) ought to read this book. It's not meant to be a comprehensive minutely detailed history of Native people and their dealings with non-Native colonialists, and their genetic and cultural ancestors, so if you're hoping for a thick tome, you might be disappointed. But, if you're open to an intelligent, personal account, written with humour, wit, and a healthy dose of irony and righteous anger, then you will definitely get your money's worth.

And how is it related to this column?


Any time we delve more deeply into the issues around environmentalism, we run into discussions of social justice. It's unavoidable, nor should it be avoided, really. We can't claim to be committed to taking care of our planet without committing to taking care of its people. And where better than to start at home?

King's book is a vitally important step toward understanding and acknowledging the history of this land, its myriad aspects, and not simply the stories written out (ever so drily) in textbooks. Canada has prided itself on its national policy of multiculturalism for decades now. With the national Truth and Reconciliation Commission and its resultant report, I think many of us have finally begun turning our gaze on ourselves.

A first step in tackling issues of social justice is defining what those issues are. It's easy to crisscross the world to discover how a commitment to social justice for all creates better lives for many. Just consider fair trade practices of coffee plantation farmers in Burundi; micro-finance initiatives for small women's manufacturing collectives in Vietnam; and advocates fighting for fair food prices and food quality in our own Artic Inuit communities.

At its heart, environmentalism, I believe, requires a wholistic approach. We're looking at worldwide phenomenon and/or initiatives, spanning years and decades, that impact thousands and hundreds of thousands of lives. Whether you THOMAS KING want to focus on your own family first, or you want to consider an entire community halfway around the world, what you're focussing on is people.

With Thomas King's An Inconvenient Indian, you can start with this land's First People.

Committee receives \$125k grant from City!

In December, the spray deck committee learned that it was successful in its application for the Neighbourhood Park Development Program (NPDP) grant from the City. This is wonderful news and a great milestone!

The Committee will apply for a matching grant from the Province (Community Facility Enhancement Program-CFEP) for another \$125,000. The deadline for this grant is March 15 and we hope to hear back by summer of 2016.

Because the grant application process took longer than originally anticipated, and because of the City's requirements to have 100% of funds in place by April for construction to begin, our spray deck will not be built in 2016.

The committee has been working tirelessly to fundraise and will continue to do so over the next year in hopes that Rio Terrace will be first in line for construction in the summer of 2017.










We thought that we would take a minute to connect to those that we didn't get the opportunity to see over the holidays. The changing of the calendar is always a great time for all of us to look forward while reflecting back. We thought that it would be a chance to communicate our thoughts, predictions and insights of the current market as we leave 2015 and anticipate the upcoming year.

So far 2016 appears to be shaping up to be the year for buyers. Anyone moving into larger homes has opportunity to save some money as we see there are considerably more listings to choose from than in times past. This is due to a couple of factors.

- Higher days on market which might mean more motivated sellers
- More inventory to choose from for buyers- more properties listed.
- Subsequently the above two factors contributing to reduced prices





Even with a hesitant market there are opportunities. With more inventory to choose from and motivated sellers we are seeing more investors and "flippers" continue to come out of the woodwork. This demographic appears to feel that given that other markets (stocks etc.) aren't consistently offering measurable returns real estate becomes a viable investment over the long term.

Interest rates continue to be low perpetuating "move up" and first time home buyers. Close to 40% of the market is purchasing homes between 300-400k



Q&A About Feeding Birds

Q:What are the red and greenish-yellow birds I'm seeing high up in evergreen trees?

The birds you are seeing are likely White-winged Crossbills or Red Crossbills, occasional visitors to the area from one year to the next. Have a look at the top of spruce trees and you'll notice the heavy cone crop this year. White-winged Crossbills feed primarily on spruce seeds while Reds prefer pine cone seeds. They feed in small flocks, jumping from branch to branch high in the trees, sending a shower of cone "chaff" to the ground, along with glistening frost catching the Sun. The distinguishing characteristic of these birds is their crossed bill, an evolutionary adaptation allowing them to feed on cone crops. Both may be seen occasionally licking salt from roads. Two white wing bars distinguish the White-winged from the Red Crossbills with the females of both species having yellow or greenish plumage. The male Reds are orangey-red or brick-red while the male Whitewinged are reddish pink. A similar cone seed eating bird is the Pine Grosbeak. It has similar colouration to the Crossbills, but can be distinguished by its stockier size and heavy, uncrossed, beak. In October, we started receiving our first reports of crossbills, from a customer in Rio Terrace in Edmonton. There had been sightings by members of the Edmonton Nature Club in rural areas around the city a month or so prior to that. They are a sight to see but don't expect to find them at your feeders. Look for them high up in evergreens.

Q:Why am I seeing Robins in the middle of winter?

As spring approaches we look forward to the rush of excitement when we see our first Robin of the year. But people are justifiably perplexed when we see them in December or January. American Robins have been seen in Central Alberta in winter on a regular basis for many years. One theory is that these winter Robins are migrants from further north, possibly Alaska. There are not that many but it's not an unusual occurrence. Last week we had calls at the store from four different people asking why they are seeing Robins in January, in flocks of as many as 30 at a time. In the Edmonton Christmas Bird Count in December, 65 Robins were counted - an increase from last year. They have also been seen in Devon,

Fort Saskatchewan, and St. Albert this winter. If the weather is not too severe, and they have access to food and open water some will remain here, surviving on crab-apples, cherries, other tree fruit, and even fish. Gerald Romanchuk of Edmonton has pictures of Robins standing on ice near open water eating minnowsRobins love to bathe, and if you are offering water in a heated bath during the winter they may take advantage of it. In spring, flocks of Robins split up, returning to more familiar behaviour - establishing territories and searching for mates and nesting locations.

Q:What is the grayish bird with some red that I'm seeing at my feeder?

This bird is most likely a Common Redpoll. They can be seen eating seeds from birch tree cones and can be attracted to backyard bird feeders. Slightly smaller than a House Sparrow, Redpolls can be identified by the daub of red feathers on the top of their head, or "poll." Their underparts are gray with lightly streaked flanks. Males often have a rosy colouration below their throat on the upper breast. Redpolls are often seen with Pine Siskins, which are about the same size as Redpolls but are brown overall with striped bellies and telltale yellow bars on their wings. Redpolls and Siskins prefer Nyjer seed, Sunflower chips or finch blends in specialized tube feeders.

Lawn bowls is one of the oldest English sports believed to have first been played in the 13th century. It was the expansion of

At the competitive level endurance, flexibility and strategy are crucial.
