We are now working with the City of Edmonton to get through the Design Phase of the project and, last month, residents had completed the survey to give us feedback on what they think the spray deck should (and should not) look like. Fundraising Goals



Another Successful Grant Awarded!

Our fundraising efforts are paying off as we have now obtained another grant worth \$125,000! The CFEP Grant was awarded to our community from the provincial government so we are getting closer to our dreams of a new spray deck next summer!

The total cost for the spray deck is approximately \$374,000, and we have now obtained \$250,000 total in grant money. We are still waiting to hear on a successful application for a federal grant, Canada 150, for up to \$100,000. Thanks to your generosity we have over \$70 000. This is so amazing. 
Events

Rio Terrace Spray Deck Survey Summary

The Rio Terrace Spray Deck Committee developed a needs assessment for community members to provide input to the design for the spray deck being installed in Summer 2017. The survey was open from September 23 to October 3, 2016. The survey link was emailed to the community league membership list, posted on the community league's website, and posted on two neighbourhood elementary schools' SchoolZone pages. There were 56 respondents.

Thank you to all adults and children who responded to the survey. This information will be shared with the City design team to guide them in creating a plan for our spray deck. We remain on track for construction in Summer 2017.

- 1. How many member of your household are on the following age groups? In the households of the 56 respondents, the following ages were identified:
 - 88 children aged 0-14
 - 106 aged 15-49
 - 35 aged 60-80+
- 2. Please rate the following Spray Deck feature according to the scale. Results below indicate sum of top 2 categories for "most like to see".







arches/loops 67% ground spray/mist 71%

tall sprayer 80%







Dumpers 67% water columns 60% aiming sprayers 53%

Of the six features respondents were asked to rate, 1 feature was most popular, 4 features were comparably preferred. The Spraydeck Committee will ensure that we have a variety of features.

3. Are there additional features for the Spray Deck and amenities that you would like the Spray Deck Committee to consider?

Additional features suggested included a snack bar, bathroom/change room, wading pool, skatepark, water trough, benches and seating, and water recycling features. The Spray Deck Committee responds to each of these suggestions:

- a. Snack bar No, there is a Mac's across the street from the park.
- b. Bathroom/change room Beyond the scope of this project. There is a port-a-potty that the community league provides each year at the playground.
- c. Wading pool No, this is a spray deck project.

- d. Skatepark features Out of scope
- e. Water trough: Out of scope
- f. Benches and seating: We will ensure we have adequate seating.
- g. Water recycling: Out of scope, Not allowed by City of Edmonton
- 4. Do you have a theme or colour scheme that you would like us to explore? Please describe what that would be, i.e. nature, trains, sea life, colour, etc.

Top theme suggestions were nature and under the sea. Specific colour suggestions were provided but were extremely varied.

Please tell us about a spray deck/park you and your family have enjoyed in Edmonton or elsewhere, and why.

This provided additional information about other spray decks and parks to consider in our development. The responses were very diverse but very few indicated reasons why. Some reasons why for the design to consider include:

- Something for all ages, size and variety of features
- Unique features
- Sand and playground near spray park makes for a diversity of play experiences
- Grassy area nearby to throw blankets down
- Spray park is in the sunshine so it is warm
- Treed green space, shade nearby
- Lots of parking
- · Heated water in the features
- Equipment separated by age levels
- 6. Are there any individuals in your household who have specific requirements that should be considered when designing the Spray Deck Park or any of the amenities?

Specific requirements indicated included

- warm water
- non-slip surface/flooring
- shade

- handicap accessible
- benches for supervisors


Non-slip surfaces are out of scope but other suggestions can be considered. There are no plans to remove any trees from the current site.

7. Redeveloping the playground and building a spray deck is a community endeavour that involves a lot of time and effort on the part of residents. This project is a great opportunity to bring neighbours together, strengthen the community and create a sense of pride in the community. Be part of something great! Every little bit counts! Can we count on your help?

Of the 56 respondents,

- 100% indicated that they did not want to be on the organizing committee
- 22% would help with fundraising
- 36% would work a bingo or casino
- 48% would donate directly
- 100% indicated they are not interested in sponsorship
- 4% would help with publicity
- 11% would provide a business or corporate donation
- 26% would help with the launch of the spray deck
- 22% would help with the volunteer committee
- 12% would provide a donation of goods or services



Questions About Feeding Wild Birds

By Dave Cleary of Wild Birds Unlimited

Q: How can I make my yard more bird-friendly? Providing trees, shrubs, flowers, and offering your birds food and water are all key components of a birdfriendly yard. You can get additional guidance from the Canadian Wildlife Federation (CWF), who have a program to certify your property as wildlife-friendly provided that specific criteria and established best practices are met. Once your yard is certified you can get an official sign to place in your garden. With certification you gain official status and personal satisfaction in being part of a community of Canadians that are helping local and migratory wildlife, including species at risk, right in your own backyard. There are at least two properties in our area that we know of that are certified, one of which is owned by a customer of ours whom we helped with the application process. Certified properties can raise awareness in their communities of the importance of gardening with wildlife in mind and that it can be done beautifully, in any gardening style you like, and in any size of yard. The CWF certification program mirrors nature by including the needs of songbirds and pollinators as well as other beneficial wild neighbours. The program also recognizes the benefits of providing artificial nesting and feeding structures, but they are also looking for a rounded approach that includes natural features which supports a diversity of wildlife. Some of you may already have backyards or properties close to or ready for certification. The photo accompanying this article is from Rachael Deitch's certified wildlife-friendly property in the city of Edmonton. Q: Why do woodpeckers not fall off the tree when they are pecking?

When you take a close look at the birds in your yard, you'll see behaviours or things about them you haven't noticed before. This is one of the fun things about observing wildlife in your yard. This question about the woodpecker is a good case in point. When you have heavy work to do, it's good to have a three point stance, and that's what a woodpecker has. Their long toes and unique tail make all the difference. Essentially, the woodpecker's tail is just like a kickstand on a bike,

which keeps it from falling over. If you observe a woodpecker as it lands, you will notice that it uses its long tail feathers to prop itself up against the tree preventing it from falling off. The strong and stiff feathers absorb the force of the woodpecker's hammering blows and help to firmly anchor it to the tree. Closer observation will also reveal that each of these unique feathers is tipped with a pointed spike. Similar in shape and function to a power pole worker's climbing spikes, the woodpecker digs them into the tree's bark as it climbs. We would love to hear your observations of birds. Keep an eye out for new discoveries in your back yard.



Q: How can I keep squirrels from eating from my bird feeders?

In the fall squirrels are constantly looking for ways to get food to store for the winter months. In addition to things like nuts and mushrooms, squirrels are quite happy to visit your feeders to collect and store the food you offer your birds. If you are having problems with squirrels eating too much of your bird food, there are a number of things you can do. The first is to set up your feeders so there is a physical barrier preventing them from getting onto your feeders. This can be done by putting your feeder on a pole they can't



they can't climb or that has a baffle on it that physically blocks them. If the feeder is under a tree or there is a way they can get on from above, we have plastic domes that

are too slippery for squirrels. There are tube feeders that have a spring loaded cover that closes over the feeding ports of the feeder when the squirrel, which is heavier than most birds, climbs onto the feeder. These made in Canada feeders are the most reliable for fending off squirrels. A new product that we carry is a suet cylinder that includes cayenne pepper mixed into the suet. This works because squirrels, like other mammals, have many taste buds and they don't like the hot pepper in the blend. Birds, unlike mammals, have very few taste buds and the cayenne pepper does not bother them. Many people enjoy the squirrels in their back yard, but if they get a bit out of hand, you can try some of these methods to prevent access to your bird feeders.




