Sticking to the Point: Seasonal Affective Disorder

The days are getting shorter, and the air is getting cooler. The last of the leaves are falling from the trees. By the time you are reading this, there will likely be snow on the ground. It's the same story every year - but that doesn't necessarily make the process any easier - especially if you suffer from Seasonal Affective Disorder.

An estimated 2-3% of Canadians experience full-blown Seasonal Depression at some point in their lives. About 15% will experience a milder form known as Seasonal Affective Disorder. I suspect there is an even larger percentage of Canadians who suffer from these issues than we realize.

Symptoms of SAD generally begin in the Autumn and extend into the Winter. The most marked signs include: an increased desire to sleep, not feeling rested, low energy during the days, low mood, increased cravings for starchy/sugary foods, weight gain, sadness, guilt, hopelessness, irritability, decreased sex drive, avoidant behaviors, etc.

Whether it is due to a lack of sunlight, dropping levels of Vitamin D, or just less of the fun, fast-paced activities that summer brings - seasonal affective disorder is a real problem, and it can make living in a city like Edmonton much more difficult during the Fall and Winter.

Let's cut to the chase and discuss how to help treat Seasonal Depression:

Light Therapy: Sitting in front of a lamp that produces at least 10,000 lux for 15-30 minutes during the morning can help to boost mood and energy levels. These lamps are generally quite affordable and easily

accessed. Natural light is obviously ideal, but this is a simple and convenient solution otherwise.

Physical Activity: Find ways to keep your body moving whether it is indoors, at a gym, or outdoors. There are many winter running groups, public skating rinks, etc., that can keep you active even in the cold. Find a winter activity that gets you excited to get outside!

Acupuncture and Chinese Medicine: These therapies can help to boost the body's "Yang" energy - the hot, active, fiery side of our physiology that is strongest in the summer. CM can help to naturally boost energy levels, improve mood, decrease stress/cravings, and boost the immune system.

Normalize Sleep Patterns: Try to keep your sleeping/waking cycle consistent to avoid throwing off your circadian rhythm.

Psychotherapy or Counselling: If you're experiencing any form of depression, it is always a good idea to sit down and talk about your symptoms with a professional who can provide coping mechanisms and tools.

Hopefully, these tips will help you to gain control of your Seasonal Affective Disorder symptoms and empower you to embrace and even *enjoy* all that Winter has to offer! Make the colder months something to be cherished rather than dreaded.



Help Preserve YEG River Valley and Ravine System Via Phone Photos

Most of us who spend time in Edmonton's river valley and ravines carry cell phones. If you are interested in helping contribute to a comprehensive data set of plants, birds, wildlife, insects and other forms of nature in our city's river valley and ravines, please participate in the iNaturalist.ca website and app. It is a great way to learn what species are known, and to submit photos that can become useful scientific data.

By helping document what lives in our river valley and ravines, you will be a citizen scientist contributing to a compelling database of why our ribbon of green must be conserved and preserved for us and

future generations.

It is also a neat way to check for records of, say, raccoons in Edmonton, which were recently in the news. There are no photos submitted from within the city limits, but there is a photo taken 3 year ago in nearby Sturgeon

Children who are raised bilingual or attend bilingual preschools, have demonstrated increased analytical and problem-solving skills, an improved capacity for abstract thinking and better working memory among other benefits.

Young children are naturally fast language learners because your little ones' minds are multiple times more capable of absorbing and retaining information than adults, therefore our brilliant/devoted teachers help to prepare for Kindergarten with a lot of fun and engaging activities, to nurture their curiosity and cultural sensitivity through activities such as indoor and outdoor play, reading of books, singing, puzzles as well as crafts, painting, block building, and field trips, such as a visit to the Edmonton Corn Maze, to establish teamwork activities as well as a visit to Edmonton's Public Libraries to enhance story time and discover the world of books.















ABOUT US



the Advent season.



Buy Nothing Rio Terrace/Quesnell Heights/Patricia Heights

The Buy Nothing Rio Terrace/Quesnell Heights/Patricia Heights Facebook group allows members to post about items they want to get rid of or ask for items they'd like to receive or borrow. The fundamental rule is that each item must be freely given with no expectation of repayment which means no buying, selling, trading ot bartering. All of this is done while building connections within our community.

Pauline Truong is an active member on our Buy Nothing Group and shared the following:

"My experience with the Buy Nothing Group has been nothing but positive. My husband

and I moved into Rio Terrace about 2 years ago and we were a bit shy and nervous when we joined the Buy Nothing Group.

As many of the residents here are long term residents, we felt like newcomers to this neighborhood. However, we were instantly welcomed into the community. I love the Buy Nothing Group because it aligns with our values of being more environmentally friendly to reuse and recycle, instead of buying new items - which adds to the landfill. It has inspired me to make it a goal this year to not buy any new clothing and only purchase or use preloved items!

The Buy Nothing group started off as a place of gifting and receiving, but it quickly became a place of community and support. I felt the strength of this community when I became pregnant with my son and got diagnosed with severe postpartum depression and anxiety. I knew nothing as a first-time mom (but after talking to many parents - who does? Am I right)?

For the first seven months, my son had acid reflux and I was having daily panic attacks each time I gave him a bottle. I had to hold him upright for at least 20-30 minutes and felt as though I lost all independence. I asked the Buy Nothing Group if anyone has a baby carrier I could borrow - I couldn't even leave my house during the first 3 months because I was so anxious all the time about everything. One of the neighbors down the street was so generous enough to lend me her baby carrier, and even delivered it to my doorstep! We soon became friends and I have gone on walks with her/ask her for baby advice. Another neighbor has gifted me her sound



machine with light projections when my son had troubles sleeping and we still use it to this day!

I felt so much support as a new mom from this neighborhood as some neighbors had invited me over for playdates/chat when I was a new mom and clueless. Another neighbor so generously volunteered to babysit my son for the day when we were getting our house painted due to a leak and had fumes everywhere. My neighbor down the street made me delicious butternut squash soup and brought goodies over when my whole family had Covid in February. Lastly, some neighbors gave out their number for me to contact if I had any questions about babies or motherhood.

These are just some examples of kindness in the community. I am happy to announce that

I am, once again, pregnant with my second baby. And I feel more confident as a mother thanks to this community."

This is a shining example of how community connections were made through the Buy Nothing group and how those connections led to friendship and support.

Eating Healthy in Winter and On a Budget

When it comes to choosing vegetables and fruit to eat, a variety is best. By choosing a variety, you'll be packing your diet with fibre, vitamins and minerals. At mealtime, try to fill half your plate with vegetables and fruits.

Fresh produce is always a healthy choice but canned and frozen vegetables and fruits are also good options. Canned vegetables and fruit can last for months and can be just as nutritious as fresh – plus, they may cost less. They are also pre-washed, cut, and cooked, saving you time when making meals.

Many types of frozen and canned produce are available throughout the year, so even when produce is not in season, there are lots of options to choose from. A few of our favourites:

- Use frozen fruits in baking.
- Thaw frozen fruit such as peach slices, and then add to yogurt or oatmeal for a breakfast or snack.
- Make an easy side dish from steamed frozen vegetables.
- Use frozen vegetables such as peppers when making a stir-fry.
- When boiling pasta, add frozen vegetables such as broccoli to the pot near the end of cooking, and then top with pasta sauce after draining.
- Use frozen dark leafy greens such as kale and spinach in an omelet or smoothie.

Ways to Use Canned Vegetables and Fruit:

- Use canned vegetables such as green beans, asparagus, carrots and peas in pasta dishes or an omelet.
- Combine canned vegetables and canned beans for a quick lunch.
- Use canned corn, peas, or tomatoes in a stir fry.
- Use canned mushrooms or other vegetables in a chili.
- Add canned corn to a quesadilla.
- Make a quick vegetable soup by adding canned corn, tomatoes and pinto beans to low-sodium chicken broth.
- Top your favourite canned fruit with some yogurt for dessert.

Be aware of the sodium (salt) and sugar content in canned or frozen vegetables. Choose canned vegetables with low-, reduced-, or no added sodium and then rinse the vegetables before using to lower the sodium content further.

Choose fruit canned in water instead of syrup or rinse it if it's in syrup. Choose frozen vegetables and fruit without added seasonings, breading, sauces, or sugars.

The nutrition facts table can always be used to compare similar foods. Aim for products that have less than 15 per cent DV (daily value) in sodium or sugar.


