

Sticking to the Point

Is Acupuncture Suitable for Children and Teenagers?

Welcome to Sticking to the Point, your regular stop for all things Acupuncture and Chinese Medicine. Today we'll discuss the benefits of Traditional Chinese Medicine in treating children and teenagers.

Children and needles. That sounds like a recipe for disaster, right? I'm sure we've all experienced the high-pitched shrieking of a youngster trying to avoid a blood draw or a vaccination. Not a pretty image. So why on Earth would I recommend Acupuncture for a kid?

Well, first of all, filiform Acupuncture needles are much thinner than a hypodermic syringe. The discomfort is minimal, and most needle insertions are completely painless. Secondly, children and teenagers respond much faster than adults and often require far less intense treatment. Many adults have become stuck in unhealthy holding patterns and chronic illness returning their bodies to balance is often a long journey. Kids are much more responsive, and their bodies adapt quickly to treatment interventions. A disorder that might take 8-10 treatments in a middle-aged person might be resolved within 2-3 treatments in a child.

Acupuncturists can often get away with using far fewer needles in pediatric cases (if they use them at all). This is especially true when treating children under the age of 3. With infants and toddlers, treatment mainly consists of acupressure or shoshinin (a gentle non-insertion technique utilizing light pressure to acupuncture points using the fingers or rounded tools), gua sha (using a flat tool made of jade or stainless steel and rubbing it along

the acupuncture meridians), or **moxibustion** (burning cylinders of mugwort to apply heat to points).

So what common pediatric concerns can Acupuncture and Chinese Medicine address? Here are some of the most frequent issues Acupuncturists treat:

- Weak digestion
- Colic
- Bedwetting
- Headaches / Migraines
- Anxiety
- Poor Sleep, Nightmares, or Night Terrors
- Aches and Pains
- Allergies and Asthma
- Difficulty focusing in school

Over my years in practice, I've seen a large increase in mental health issues, headaches, and sleep disturbances in patients under 18. As a practitioner, I think it is important that we introduce the younger generation to complementary medicine and paramedical services as early as possible. That way, we can put them on a healing path before imbalances become longstanding issues.

So, when it comes to Acupuncture, it's worth a try! Who knows, your child might surprise you. I've seen kids much braver in the face of needles than some of my adult patients.

Community Soccer Outdoor Soccer is Underway!

The 2023 outdoor Rio Terrace community soccer program is now underway – a sure sign for our community that Spring has arrived!

Rio Terrace Soccer has over 290 soccer playing youths participating in the Rio Terrace community youth soccer program. Players and parents are thrilled to be back outside enjoying soccer.

Community soccer league play started the first week of May and some teams have been practising, gathering, running, etc. Since the middle of April, soccer is underway 6 days a week in some households! Rio Terrace teams generally have full rosters as we have lots of interested players in our community.

In the U9 through U19 community soccer program, we have some 200 players populating the rosters of 12 Rio Terrace based teams.

Rio Terrace is hosting 2 girls teams this season, 1 each in U11 & U13. On the boys side, Rio Terrace has 9 teams – 2 in each of U9, U11 & U17, with 1 team in each of U13, U15 & U19. All of these teams will generally play a 15 game schedule during May and June, with 2 games and 1 practice each week. They also are likely to play in the EMSA West zone soccer tournament the weekend of June 2-4 and of course all are hoping to qualify for City of Edmonton finals the week of July 2-8.

The Rio Terrace FunSoccer program serves as the introduction to soccer for the younger players in our community. We have 90 players registered and playing in our U4 / U5 and U7 program. These players participate in skill development games and drills at the soccer field on the north side of the Rio Terrace School every Monday and Wednesday evening

between 6:15 and 7:15 from May 8 through to June 21. Players and parents both participate in this program where fun, being active and learning soccer skills are the goals.

Thank you to our soccer coaches and managers!

We as a community owe a huge Thank You to all of the parents who give so generously their time, energy, knowledge, patience, etc, to coach or manage our youths in the game of soccer. Rio Terrace is the envy of most other community soccer programs as we have a supportive group of knowledgeable volunteers who make sure that there are coaches and managers for each and every soccer team. If we have enough players to form a team, I am always able to find parents willing to be the coaches and managers for these teams. Thank You all yet again.







2023 FLAG League Information

Commitment: The EFCL League runs from Sept 5th - Oct 22nd, 2023 every week (with the exception of the Thanksgiving Day long weekend). Recreational games will take place at the participating Community Leagues, Competitive games will take place at Central Hubs and teams will play a total of 8 games in (6) weeks with no additional practices. Schedules will vary by team, but times will stay consistent from week to week. Times will be determined closer to the season as details are finalized.

Investment: Early Bird Price \$210 until May 31st. Starting June 1st the fee is \$250. This fee includes NFL Flag Team Reversible Jersey, NFL Flag Shorts, Flags, Football Alberta Membership, Football Canada Membership, Accident Insurance, Liability Insurance, Quality Trained Coaches (dependent on age level), and Field Rentals.

Team assignments are by community. Teams are distributed to ensure even numbers on each team (8 - 10 players/team). Players will be placed in divisions based on their age as of December 31, 2023.

General Details

The only additional equipment needed is a good pair of runners or cleats and a water bottle.

No experience is necessary. Divisions will focus on 5 on 5 Flag Football.

One of our community members, Shannon Darvill, had the following to say about the Buy Nothing Group:





Tennis Courts:

These courts are for Rio Terrace Community League Members with active memberships and their guests:

- email the membership director (as listed online) for the access code please include your proof of membership
- the membership director will try to reply to your message within 48 hours.

Note: Ensure you're on the community email list as the access code may be changed at any time and the updated code is sent via email.

Tennis Court Protocols:

Enjoy the facilities and fellow players/groups but recognize that all community tennis and basketball users do so at their own risk. Please don't do anything that will compromise your health, our facilities, or our community reputation.

Please follow these protocols of conduct:

These courts are first come first served. Please be considerate of others & limit your game to 30 minutes for singles & 45 minutes for doubles if others are waiting. Queued players are to remain outside of court area.

Please wear soft-soled, non-marking shoes on the courts. Do not sit, swing, or stand on net cable.

Courts are for tennis & basketball* play only (*basketball limited to basketball net areas only). As such, please enjoy your skateboard, rollerblades, bicycle, play ball hockey /soccer, etc. off the courts.

No food or glass containers allowed within the court area. Vaping, smoking, alcohol, etc. is a private choice & this is a public space enjoy such things elsewhere.

Your pet will enjoy watching from the other side of the chain link; please keep your pets & 4-legged cheering squad off the courts.

All players must ensure gates are locked when departing. Please do not share the access code with anyone. Even if they say they're members.

Master Plan for Strathcona County Regional Park Finalized

Located north of Township Road 540, where the new River Valley Alliance pedestrian bridge will connect to 167 Ave in Edmonton, this Regional Park is being promoted as a regenerative riverside park, which balances outdoor recreation nature appreciation and historical recognition, while fostering a healthy connected river valley system. It will reach across two quarter sections, or 290 acres, of land.

Previously used as a gravel quarry, North River Park, will be the key wildlife biodiversity zone, where forest and riparian restoration will take place.
Construction includes topographic diversity, with hills created from earthmoving operations around wetlands. Within this portion, a north flood park will be developed, which will be designed to handle a one-in-one-hundred-year flood.

In South Wetland Park, existing ponds will be modified for wetland restoration. "The wetlands are one of the most unique aspects of this property, so developing boardwalks and pathways on the edges of them and

through them will create really wonderful experiences and educational opportunities for school groups and visitors to the region," according to the lead architect, Matt Williams.

The Central Gathering Place will have a visitor pavilion with outdoor seating, an adjacent plaza for community and school gatherings and a natural playground that uses the terrain for different play experiences. Connecting all three spaces will be the trail networks, which will focus on usage in all four seasons, so cross-country ski trails will be added.

As the ecosystems start to regenerate we'll have these wonderful loops of natural trails within forests, shrub-land, and grasslands, which all have the opportunities to have interpretative signage and diversity of experience to really enjoy and connect people with nature," said Williams. 

Keep Your Heart Healthy by Walking

You can improve your heart health simply by walking.

A form of aerobic exercise, walking is one of the easiest ways to increase your physical activity and improve your heart's health.

Physical activity increases your <u>heart rate</u>, strengthens the heart muscle, and increases blood circulation through your body, bringing more oxygen and nutrients to your organs. Exercise also increases your lungs' ability to take in oxygen. It lowers blood pressure and helps to reduce body fat. It also improves blood sugar and cholesterol levels.

Have a checkup before beginning an exercise program. If you have heart problems, your doctor may want to do tests to find out how much activity your heart can safely handle. Start out slowly, with a warm-up in the beginning. Get faster in the middle of your walk. Then have a cool-down at the end.

Use a phone app or buy a pedometer to count your steps every day. Set a goal to increase the number of steps you take each day or week. Many people work toward a goal of 10,000 steps a day but set a target that works for you.

To stay motivated, walk with friends, coworkers or pets. Ask friends and co-workers to join you. Turn a walk into a brainstorming session with a co-worker. Join a walking group or club. Plan family outings around walks together. Set goals. Work towards doing at least 2.5 hours of moderate to vigorous exercise a week. One way to do this is to walk 30 minutes a day, at least five days a week.

Schedule walks on your business calendar. Walk whenever possible. Take opportunities such as walking to work, school, around an entire park, to do errands the grocery store, or to a restaurant.

Set a goal to participate in an organized fitness walk.

Walk before or after work, or on your lunch break. Instead of taking a snack or coffee break, take a walk break.

If the weather is bad, use a treadmill. Or take comfortable shoes to the mall and walk several laps inside.

Wear comfortable shoes and socks that cushion your feet.

Drink plenty of water. Take a bottle with you when you walk.

Be safe and know your surroundings. Walk in a well-lit, safe place.


