Minutes

Finance Report – Brandon submitted via email:

As previously alluded to, we are not exactly in great shape, financially. After the most recent mold remediation/exterior renovation expenses, we'll have around \$7500 in the Casino account, and \$37000 in the Operating account. We should get our Community League Operating Grant (CLOG) soon, and I would guess it'll be around \$11k as it has been the last few years, but that leaves us at around \$55k total cash until our next casino in 2024, barring any other major expenses or unexpected repairs.

Per the report, general repairs this year have been ~11k, utilities ~7k, janitorial \$8k, and insurance \$7k = \$33k, plus any additional expenses, events, etc. Rink attendant wages were \$27k this fiscal year - they could probably be a bit lower, but nothing super significant. I do think we should have a discussion around rink viability this winter, and obviously try to minimize any other expenses wherever possible... it is what it is!

Hall Rental report – Carrie submitted via email:

There wasn't a lot of activity in the hall in May. There was a memorial last weekend and they had rented on the Saturday and Sunday just to make things easier on them but we already put through the money for that on the Apr Invoice. The next thing coming up will be the family Sunday on June 3 and then the band that's coming to play on the ninth not much else happening in the hall thus far and then I just need to know if Steve is going ahead or not so we can account for that. All the best to everybody.

- Takes ownership of courts in good and bad ways
- History of kicking people off the courts
- Last spring we drafted agreement for times when he could use the courts
- Have had issues since agreement last year, intimidating kids wanting to play basketball on empty courts
- Has been using all four courts, community members were turned away, told them to go to Laurier
- Two issues at hand: counter proposal, wants to pay \$500/month instead of per person tabulation
- Does Steve do clean up of courts? Leaves, garbage, etc.
- What do we do if we get more reports of him violating the terms of the agreement? Do we wait for next report?
- Once we have the security cameras we can check the footage quickly and easily.
- Andrew says only ~25% of issues are reported
- Different potential timeframes for contracts: May -June, July August, September onwards
- Alex suggests finish spring session and then not renew contract, or let him finish summer term and then not renew after that
- Kristin agrees with not renewing, has had negative interactions with Steve
- New etiquette signs are now up, Andrew put up a few weeks ago
- Only positive is that he cleans up but new signs should help direct people to contact us when they find debris on the court that needs to be cleaned up
- His fees for this summer would be about \$5000 (hall and courts)
- One suggestion is one last chance, any more complaints and his contract is terminated
- Let him know contract won't be renewed after summer term, if any complaints it will be terminated earlier, if he can find somewhere to go for the summer term we can terminate contract early
- We do not have quorum so will have to send out an email motion
- Marly will draft motion, send to Andrew and Emma to review and then will send out to board members to vote on
- Kristin asked why we need to vote on this, Emma explained we would be voting to end business relationship with Steve

NRC Report - Week of May 23-26, 2023 Stuart York

The 2023 Litter Kit Service will be available from April 1 - October 31, OR, until the supplies run out. Edmontonians can request the amount needed via the Google form on the City's website our website starting April 1, 2023. Each litter kit contains 3 black garbage bags, 1 blue recycling bag, a few nitrile gloves and a safety guideline sheet.

The program will also be providing a large number of litter kits and litter pickers to EFCL's centralized location in the last week of April (as requested by EFCL), as their membership supplies start on May 5. Any community leagues you work with that are interested in getting supplies, there can:

- 1. pick up the supplies with EFCL on May 5 through EFCL OR
- 2. request supplies via our website on April 1 if they need it sooner than May 5, 2023

Are there any community organizations in your neighbourhood interested in developing a community waste of litter removal project? The **Community Clean Up Grant** empowers residents to take on initiatives promoting community cleanliness, community-based waste reduction strategies, and community engagement.

The grant offers up to \$600 for community clean-up projects and up to \$1000 for projects that include reuse and waste diversion initiatives. Applications open on March 15, 2023.

Festival and Events Micro Grant

The Festival and Events Micro Grant program has been created to support smaller, outdoor community (niche) festivals and events that showcase local talent, celebrate local histories and cultures, and add vibrancy to our City throughout the year.

This program is available to registered not-for-profit, charitable organizations, and business improvement areas. The festival or event must take place by <u>December 31</u>, <u>2023</u>.

The maximum grant is up to 50% of eligible expenses up to a maximum of \$10,000; the minimum grant amount will be \$500. *Please note that groups are only eligible to receive one of the Festival and Events Micro Grant, Neighbourhood Services Micro Grant, or Neighbourhood Connections grant for a single event.

The deadline to apply is April 30. Visit the website for more information.
